- Indianapolis-based governing body of the IZOD IndyCar Series and Firestone Indy Lights.

IZOD IndyCar Series

- The premier series of INDYCAR, which debuted in January 1996.
- IZOD IndyCar Series should be used in all references. (e.g. IZOD IndyCar Series cars, IZOD IndyCar Series champion, IZOD IndyCar Series driver).

Firestone Indy Lights

- The official development series of INDYCAR, which debuted in July 2002.
- Firestone Indy Lights should be used in all references. (e.g. Firestone Indy Lights cars, Firestone Indy Lights champion, Firestone Indy Lights driver).

Mazda Road to Indy

- The official ladder system of INDYCAR, which debuted in 2010 consisting of the IZOD IndyCar Series, Firestone Indy Lights, Pro Mazda Championship presented by Cooper Tires and the Cooper Tires USF2000 Championship powered by Mazda.

Other Key Terms:

- Holmatro Safety Team: Official name of the track safety unit of INDYCAR. Holmatro Safety Team should be used in all references.
- E85: Official name of the fuel used by the IZOD IndyCar Series. Fuel is a blend of 85 percent ethanol and 15 percent racing gasoline.
- IR-12: Official name of the 2012 IZOD IndyCar Series chassis built by Dallara Automobili. Also called DW12 in honor of the late Dan Wheldon, the car's first test driver.
- Honda Racing HI13R: Official name of Honda's turbocharged V-6 IZOD IndyCar Series engine.
- Chevrolet IndyCar V6: Official name of Chevrolet's twin-turbocharged V-6 IZOD IndyCar Series engine
- Race car: Not racecar.
- Racetrack: Not race track; also applies to superspeedway.
- SAFER Barrier: Acronym for the Steel and Foam Energy Reduction Barrier in place at oval tracks. Note the uppercase "B" in all references.
- SWEMS: Acronym for the Suspension and Wheel Energy Management System employed on all IndyCar Series and Indy Pro Series cars.
- Turn: Uppercase in all references (e.g. Turn 4); also applies to laps (e.g. Lap 100).

IZOD IndyCar Series prepares for Toronto doubleheader

Honda Indy Toronto will mark the second of three doubleheaders on the 2013 IZOD IndyCar Series schedule. The series will race a pair of 85-lap races Saturday and Sunday on the 1.75-mile temporary street circuit, posing a unique challenge for IZOD IndyCar Series drivers and teams. Who will be crowned Toronto's king of the street.

Standing starts to debut at Toronto

The IZOD IndyCar Series will conduct a standing start for the first time in the first race of the Two in T.O. doubleheader. The last time an Indy car race had a standing start was at Long Beach in 2008 when Will Power swept around the first three cars to take the lead. How will the first standing start go in Toronto?

Will anyone have a SONAX Perfect Finish?

SONAX, the official automobile detail partner of INDYCAR, will offer a \$100,000 bonus to any driver who can sweep both races at Toronto. The SONAX Perfect Finish Award offers a \$50,000 bonus to any driver who wins both races of a doubleheader weekend. No driver won the award at Belle Isle, so the \$50,000 bonus doubles for the 2 in T.O. twin bill. Can anyone have a Perfect Finish at Toronto.

Resurgent Ganassi team seeks another Toronto win

After sweeping the podium at Pocono, Chip Ganassi Racing hopes to recapture its success on the streets of Toronto, where it has won four times previously. Dario Franchitti is a three-time winner at Exhibition Place, Scott Dixon has four top-five finishes in six previous starts and Charlie Kimball scored his first podium in 2012. Can Ganassi make it two-straight sweeps?

Castroneves aims for his first win in Toronto

Helio Castroneves took control of the IZOD IndyCar Series point standings with his victory at Texas Motor Speedway in June and carries a 23-point advantage into the Honda Indy Toronto Two in T.O. doubleheader weekend. But the Brazilian hasn't fared well in Toronto, scoring his best finish of sixth last season. Can Castroneves score his first win in Toronto and maintain his advantage over Andretti Autosport's duo of Ryan Hunter-Reay and Marco Andretti?

Hunter-Reay seeks repeat win on streets of Toronto

Reigning IZOD IndyCar Series champion Ryan Hunter-Reay used a three-race win streak that included a victory at Toronto to propel himself into championship contention in 2012. He returns to the track seeking his fourth straight trip to the podium. Can Hunter-Reay, who repeated at Milwaukee, make history repeat itself again at Toronto?

Welcome to Hinchtown

James Hinchcliffe attended every Honda Indy Toronto since he was 18-months old. This year, the Toronto native returns to his hometown race as a favorite to win. Can Hinch, who leads the series with three wins, visit Victory Lane in his hometown for the first time?

Will to win at Toronto?

Will Power hasn't won a race in 2013, but the 2010 Honda Indy Toronto champion would like to add another win on the streets of Exhibition Place to his resume. The Australian has a pair of wins at Toronto, winning in 2007 at the temporary circuit in Champ Car and again in 2010. Can Power, the 2011 pole winner, become a three-time race winner at the circuit?

Wilson hopes to make it back to victory lane

Justin Wilson has visited Victory Lane at Toronto before and aims to bring Dale Coyne Racing back. Wilson, who won a race and pole at Toronto in Champ Car, sat on the pole in 2010. Can Wilson again find success and give Dale Coyne Racing its second win of the season?

Andretti aims to end winless drought

The Andretti name has been a major part of open-wheel racing history at Toronto. Michael Andretti won a record seven times on the temporary street course. Now Marco Andretti returns to the circuit in search of adding to his family's legacy at the track. Can Marco, who stands third in IZOD IndyCar Series points, find success on the Toronto circuit like his father?

Race Notes:

- The Honda Indy Toronto 2 in T.O. doubleheader will be the fifth and sixth IZOD IndyCar Series races on the streets of Exhibition Place. Ryan Hunter-Reay was 2012 race winner.
- Dario Franchitti and Hunter-Reay are the only drivers to win IZOD IndyCar Series race on the streets of Toronto and the championship in the same season. Franchitti won the inaugural IZOD IndyCar Series race in 2009 and again in 2011. Hunter-Reay won in 2012. Seven other drivers have claimed the Indy car championship in the same season they won at Toronto. They are: Bobby Rahal (1986), Al Unser Jr. (1990), Michael Andretti (1991), Alex Zanardi (1998), Cristiano da Matta (2002), Paul Tracy (2003) and Sebastien Bourdais (2004).
- Since 1993, a driver won the 12th race of the season and the championship eight times. Dario Franchitti (2010, Mid-Ohio), Sam Hornish Jr. (2006, Kentucky), Sebastien Bourdais (2005, Australia; 2004, Las Vegas), Cristiano da Matta (2002, Road America), Alex Zanardi (1997, Michigan), Jacques Villeneuve (1995, Cleveland), Al Unser Jr. (1994, New Hampshire).
- Since 1993, a driver won the 13th race of the season and the championship seven times. Scott Dixon (2008 Edmonton), Sebastien Bourdais (2007, Australia), Dan Wheldon (2005, Pikes Peak), Paul Tracy (2003, Mid-Ohio), Sam Hornish Jr. (2001, Texas2), Alex Zanardi (1997, Mid-Ohio), Al Unser Jr. (1994, Vancouver).
- Twenty-three (23) drivers entered in the event have competed in Indy car races at Toronto. Alex Tagliani (12) has the most starts at Toronto among the entered drivers. Tristan Vautier (0) has the fewest.
- Past winners at Toronto entered in this year's race are: Ryan Hunter-Reay (2012) Dario Franchitti (2011, 2009, 1999), Will Power (2010, 2007), Justin Wilson (2005) and Sebastien Bourdais (2004).
- Drivers who have won poles at Toronto entered in this year's race are: Dario Franchitti (1997, 1998, 2009, 2012), Will Power (2011), Justin Wilson (2010, 2006), Sebastien Bourdais (2007, 2005, 2004), and Helio Castroneves (2000)
- Chip Ganassi Racing has won four times at Toronto: Michael Andretti (1994), Alex Zanardi (1998) and Dario Franchitti (2009 and 2011.)
- Team Penske has two wins at the track (Paul Tracy 1993 and Will Power 2010). It has six pole positions at the track: Danny Sullivan (1988 and 1990), Emerson Fittipaldi (1993), Helio Castroneves (2000), Gil de Ferran (2001) and Will Power (2011).
- Andretti Autosport is the only other active team to win at Toronto. Team owner Michael Andretti won at Toronto seven times as a driver.

Season to Date:

- **Scott Dixon** led the first podium sweep for Chip Ganassi Racing when he won the Pocono INDYCAR 400 Fueled by Sunoco. It was his first win of 2013 and the 30th of his Indy car career.
- **Marco Andretti** won his second pole position of 2013 at Pocono. It was his fourth career pole position.
- **James Hinchcliffe** won the Iowa Corn Indy 250. It was his third win of 2013 and the fourth straight win at Iowa for Andretti Autosport. Helio Castroneves won qualifying heat #3 to secure his first pole of the season.
- **Ryan Hunter-Reay** won Milwaukee IndyFest for the second consecutive year. It was Hunter-Reay's second win of 2013 and the fourth for Andretti Autosport in 2013.
- **Helio Castroneves** won his 28th Indy car race in the Firestone 550 at Texas Motor Speedway.
- **Will Power** won his 31st career Indy car pole at Texas.
- **Mike Conway** and **Simon Pagenaud** split the wins in the Chevrolet Indy Dual in Detroit. It was Conway's second Indy car win and Pagenaud's first Indy car victory.
- **Tony Kanaan** won the 97th Indianapolis 500 to record his 16th Indy car victory.
- **Ed Carpenter** won his first pole position since 2010 at Kentucky when he won the pole for the 97th Indianapolis 500.
- There were a race-record 14 leaders and race-record 68 lead changes at Indianapolis.
- **James Hinchcliffe** won the Itaipava Sao Paulo Indy 300 with a last-lap, last-turn pass of Takuma Sato. It was his second win of 2013 and the third win in four races for Andretti Autosport.
- **Takuma Sato** won his first Indy car race in the Toyota Grand Prix of Long Beach. He was the 208th driver to win an Indy car race and first Japanese driver to win. It was A.J. Foyt's first win as a car owner since 2002.
- **Dario Franchitti** won his 30th career Indy car pole at Long Beach.
- **Ryan Hunter-Reay** won his 10th Indy car race in the Honda Indy Grand Prix of Alabama at Barber Motorsports Park from the pole position. It was the second time he had won a race from pole.
- **James Hinchcliffe** won the season-opening Honda Grand Prix of St. Petersburg. It was the first win of his Indy car career. He was the 207th driver to win an Indy car race.
- **Will Power** won his 30th career Indy car pole at St. Petersburg.
- **Tristan Vautier** started his first career IZOD IndyCar Series race at St. Petersburg.

Milestones & Records:

- Should **Dario Franchitti** win the 2013 IZOD IndyCar Series championship, he will join A.J. Foyt as the only drivers to win at least five Indy car titles in their career. Franchitti won the title in 2007 and again from 2009-2011. Foyt won seven championships in his career.
- With their next victory, either **Dario Franchitti** or **Sebastien Bourdais** will move into sole possession of seventh place on the all-time wins list. Franchitti and Bourdais are tied with Paul Tracy with 31 wins.
- **Scott Dixon** extended his streak of consecutive seasons with a win to nine with his win at Pocono Raceway.
- **Scott Dixon** moved into sole possession of 10th place on the all-time wins list with his win at Pocono Raceway. Dixon won his 30th race to break a tie with Rick Mears.
- **Helio Castroneves** moved into sole possession of 11th place on the all-time victory list with his win at Texas Motor Speedway on June 8. Castroneves won his 29th race to break a tie with **Johnny Rutherford**.
- **Helio Castroneves** needs two earned poles to reach 40 career poles in his Indy car career after he won the Verizon P1 Award at Iowa Speedway.
- **Will Power** recorded the 30th pole of his Indy car career at St. Petersburg and his 31st pole position at Texas.
- **Dario Franchitti** recorded the 30th pole of his Indy car career at Long Beach and his 31st pole position at Detroit 1.

- **Scott Dixon** needs two earned poles to reach 20 in his Indy car career.
- With one pole in 2013, **Scott Dixon** will extend his IZOD IndyCar Series streak to seven consecutive seasons.
- **Scott Dixon's** second-place finish at Barber was the 30th of his Indy car career. It tied **Helio Castroneves**, **A.J. Foyt**, **Al Unser Jr.**, and **Bobby Unser** for fifth on the all-time list.
- **Tony Kanaan** tied **Helio Castroneves** for 10th on the all-time top-five list by recording his 110th top-five finish at Iowa.
- **Scott Dixon** recorded the 100th top-five finish of his Indy car career at Barber Motorsports Park. With his win at Pocono, Dixon broke a tie with Paul Tracy for 12th on the all-time list.
- **Tony Kanaan** will attempt to make his 208th consecutive start. **Jimmy Vasser** holds the all-time record of 211. **Scott Dixon** with 149 straight starts (Tied with Michel Jourdain for 6th all-time), **Marco Andretti** with 125 straight starts (15th all-time) and Ryan Hunter-Reay with 100 straight starts are the only other active drivers with a streak of more than 100 consecutive starts.

- **Scott Dixon** extended his streak of consecutive seasons with at least one win to nine with his win at Pocono Raceway on July 7.
- **Helio Castroneves** moved into sole possession of 11th place on the all-time wins list with his win at Texas Motor Speedway on June 8. Castroneves' 28th career win broke a tie for 12th with **Johnny Rutherford** with the victory.
- With their next victory, either **Dario Franchitti** or **Sebastien Bourdais** will move into seventh (7th) on the all-time wins list. The pair is tied with Paul Tracy with 31 wins.

POLES

- **Helio Castroneves** needs two earned poles to reach 40 career poles in his Indy car career. He remains the active leader in poles after winning the Verizon P1 Award at Iowa.
- **Will Power** earned the 31st pole of his Indy car career at Texas to tie Sebastien Bourdais and Dario Franchitti for seventh all-time. Power needs one pole to tie Michael Andretti for sixth all-time.
- **Dario Franchitti** recorded the 30th pole of his Indy car career at Long Beach and his 31st pole position at Detroit 1. Franchitti needs one pole to tie Michael Andretti for sixth all-time.
- **Scott Dixon** needs two earned poles to reach 20 in his Indy car career.
- With his next pole, **Scott Dixon** will extend his IZOD IndyCar Series streak to seven consecutive seasons with at least one pole.

STARTS

- **Tony Kanaan** will attempt to make his 208th consecutive start. **Jimmy Vasser** holds the all-time record of 211. **Scott Dixon** with 149 straight starts, **Marco Andretti** with 124 straight starts and Ryan Hunter-Reay with 100 straight starts are the only other active driver with a streak of 100 consecutive starts or more.
- **Sebastien Bourdais** made his 100th Indy car start at Detroit 1

LAPS LED

- **Helio Castroneves** needs to lead 68 laps to surpass 5,000 laps led in his Indy car career. Castroneves has led 4,933 laps in his Indy car career and is the active lap leader.
- **Dario Franchitti** surpassed 4,500 laps led in his Indy car career in 2012. Franchitti has led 4,542 laps in his career.
- **Scott Dixon** led 38 laps at Pocono and surpassed 4,000 laps led in his Indy car career. Dixon has led 4,027
- **Will Power** led 16 laps at Indianapolis to surpass 1,700 laps led in his Indy car career. Power has led 1,737 laps in his career.

PODIUM FINISHES

- **Dario Franchitti** is the active leaders in podium finishes with 89, which is fifth on the all-time list. Franchitti broke a tie with Bobby Rahal and Al Unser Jr. with his third-place finish at Pocono

WALKER NAMED TO SENIOR MANAGEMENT ROLE AT INDYCAR

Respected longtime motorsports executive Derrick Walker will become President, Operations & Competition of INDYCAR, effective May 27, Hulman & Company chief executive officer Mark Miles announced today.

Walker will be responsible for all technical and competition aspects of the racing operations at the open-wheel sanctioning body.

"We're pleased to welcome Derrick Walker to this vital role," said Mark Miles, chief executive officer, Hulman & Company, the parent company of INDYCAR. "We spoke with many of our constituents about an ideal person for this job, and Derrick's name emerged early and often.

"After speaking with many talented candidates, Derrick stood out because his decades of experience in North American open-wheel racing blend ownership and management for his own race teams and other teams. He understands how to balance the technical and financial operations of our sport, and his confident leadership will provide a firm, clear direction for long-term INDYCAR operations and competition."

Walker's senior-level leadership experience will help him to foster improved communication with INDYCAR team owners and suppliers in these crucial areas:

- Cost management
- Enhancing innovation within the current technical platform and race formats
- Continuing to emphasize and develop safety initiatives
- Sustaining programs and avenues to develop drivers and suppliers for the IZOD IndyCar Series
- Developing plans for future technical platforms

"I have had the opportunity to participate in the business of professional racing my entire life, and I have gained valuable experience from many different angles," Walker said. "Leading the operations and competition aspects of INDYCAR is a perfect place to leverage my experiences and relationships to help ensure that INDYCAR racing is exciting and engaging for our fans, that our drivers and owners are able to showcase their talents through our events, and that our technical partners are able to use our racing platform for innovation and development."

Reporting directly to Walker will be Brian Barnhart, who will serve as senior vice president of operations; race director Beaux Barfield; vice president of technology Will Phillips; vice president of technology, timing and scoring Jon Koskey; director of grassroots initiatives Jason Penix; and Firestone Indy Lights director Anton "Tony" George Jr.

Walker, 68, comes to INDYCAR after serving as general manager for Ed Carpenter Racing in the IZOD IndyCar Series, leading the team to a victory last September at Auto Club Speedway in the team's first season.

A native of Scotland, Walker brings more than 40 years of experience in many forms of racing to INDYCAR, beginning as a mechanic and culminating in the creation and ownership of a successful racing team, Walker Motorsports, Ltd., since 1990. Over his career, Walker has worked with teams like Ferrari in sports car racing, Brabham and Penske Racing in Formula One, and Porsche and Penske Racing in Indy car. Walker spent 13 years with legendary Indianapolis 500 team owner Roger Penske as part of Penske Cars Ltd., which designed and manufactured race-winning Penske Indy cars in the United Kingdom, and also served as vice president of racing for Penske Racing.

Throughout Walker's 19 years as a team owner, he fielded multi-car teams in 414 races in IndyCar, Firestone Indy Lights and Formula BMW, earning six victories and 16 poles with drivers such as Gil de Ferran, Scott Goodyear, Christian Fittipaldi, Sarah Fisher, Alex Tagliani, Will Power, Simon Pagenaud and Paul Tracy. The team made Indianapolis 500 history in 1991 by fielding an entry for Willy T. Ribbs, who became the first African-American to qualify for the race

INDYCAR OUTLINES LONG-TERM COMPETITION STRATEGY AND TIMELINE

In its continued effort to open the door to increased technical innovation in its cars and further its longstanding effort to improve safety in open-wheel racing, INDYCAR outlined today its long-term IZOD IndyCar Series competition strategy. The timeline begins immediately and runs through the 2021 season.

Immediate initiatives include INDYCAR and Dallara looking to reduce the surface area of the underbody of the current chassis to reduce the potential for lift in preparation for the addition of various aerodynamic configurations in 2015. The project is underway and will conclude this fall.

Aero configuration kits will be introduced and utilized for all races on the 2015 schedule and include specifications for superspeedway and road/street/short oval configurations.

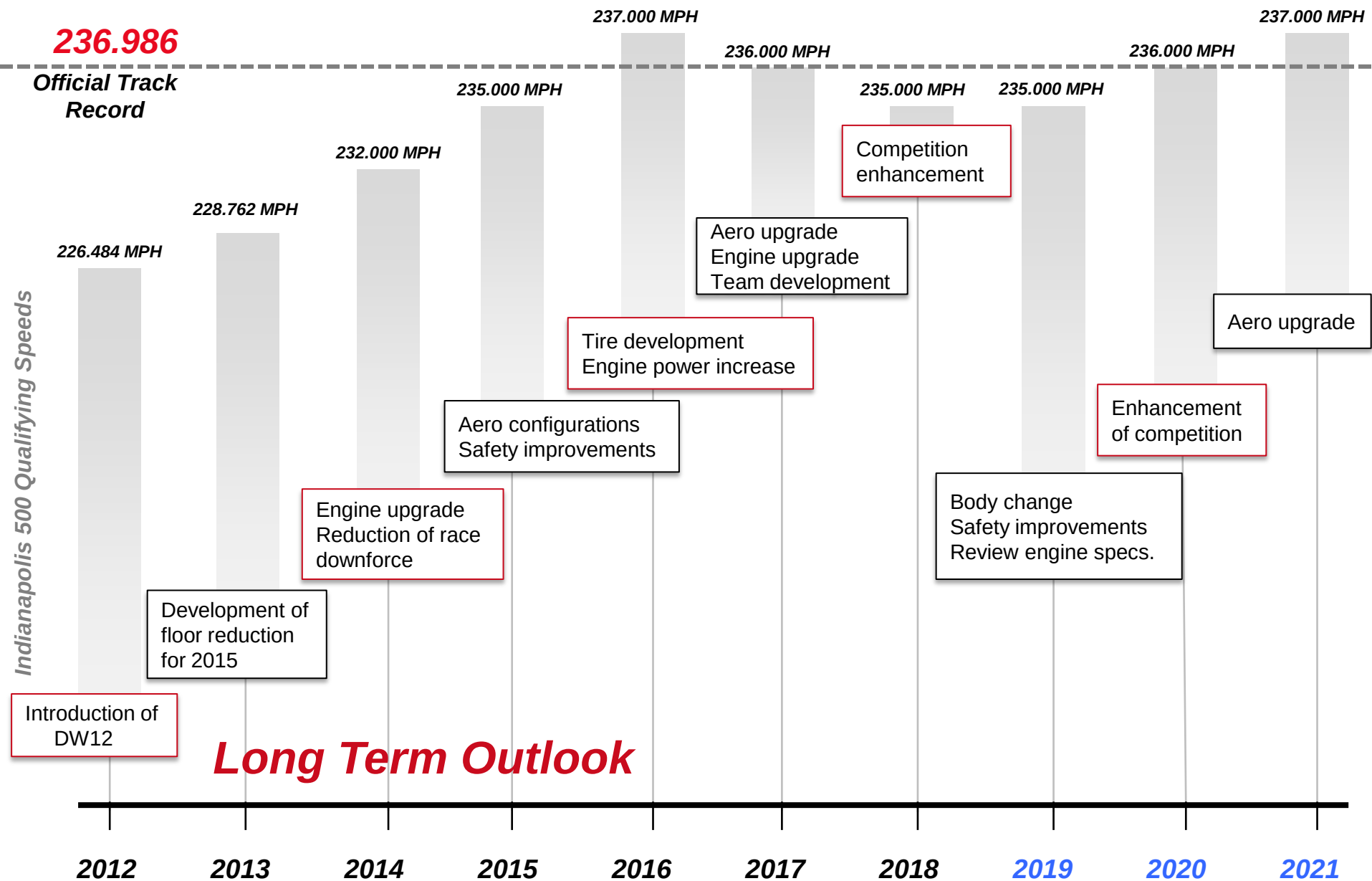
Areas open for development by INDYCAR-approved aero configuration kit manufacturers could include sidepods, engine cover and front and rear wing end plates. Mainplane inclusion in aero configuration kits is dependent on underwing development and will be determined at a later date. INDYCAR expects to announce manufacturer participation in July.

"This is the first step in making the incremental changes to our cars toward further enhancing speed, innovation and safety," said Derrick Walker, president of competition and operations, INDYCAR. "As we continue to look at all methods of advancing safety and competition, our initial task is to prepare our current chassis for the further increases of speed we hope to see with the addition of new aero configurations in 2015."

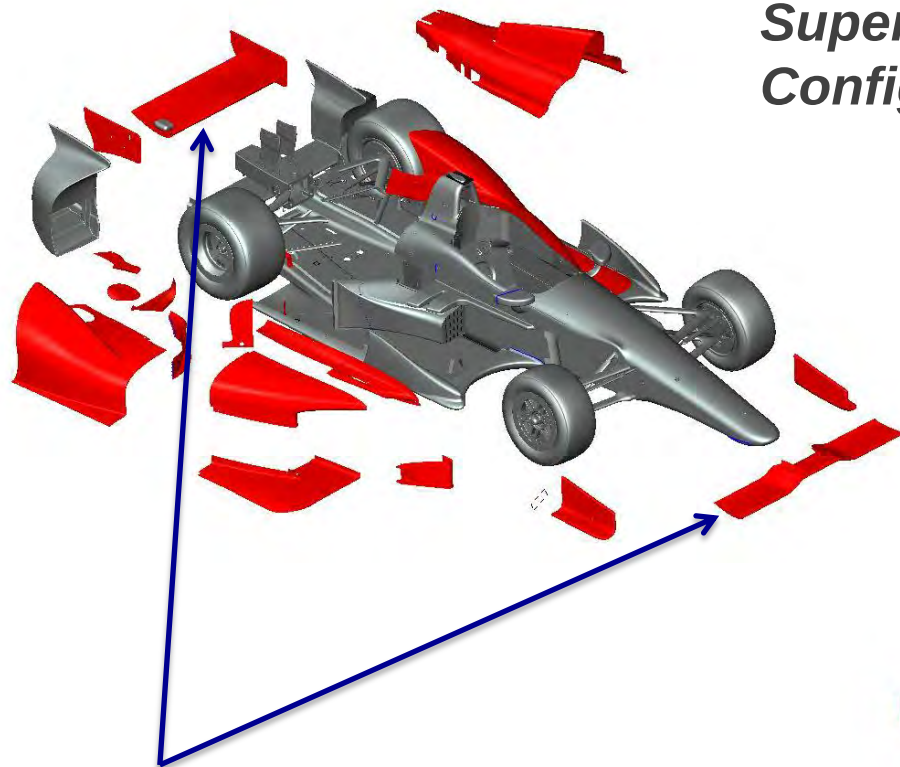
Initiatives outlined as part of the IZOD IndyCar Series long-term strategy include:

- 2013 - INDYCAR and Dallara look to reduce the surface area of the underbody of the current chassis to reduce the potential for lift in preparation for the addition of various aerodynamic configurations in 2015.
- 2014 - Engine upgrades as part of the current homologation process; downforce adjustments to enhance racing, overtaking as well as safety at various racetrack configurations, as needed.
- 2015 - Aero configuration components introduced for the full IZOD IndyCar Series season in conjunction with potential enhancements to the underbody.
- 2016 - Opportunity for tire development, if needed, with Firestone, as well as engine power enhancements as required.
- 2017 - Possible aero configuration kits and engine upgrades. Potential for areas on car to be opened for team development.
- 2018 - Competition enhancements made based on performance of 2017 package.
- 2019 - Potential introduction of new body style and engine formula.
- 2020 - Competition enhancements made based on performance of 2019 package.
- 2021 - Possible aero configuration upgrade.

"Our long-term competition strategy is designed to build on the foundation of our current package with progressive and methodical enhancements in conjunction with our manufacturers, teams and drivers," added Walker. "Always with an eye towards safety, our timeline will build on our already exciting product and create opportunities for us to move the performance barrier forward through enhancements designed to balance the longevity of our current car-engine platform as we build toward the next generation IndyCar package."

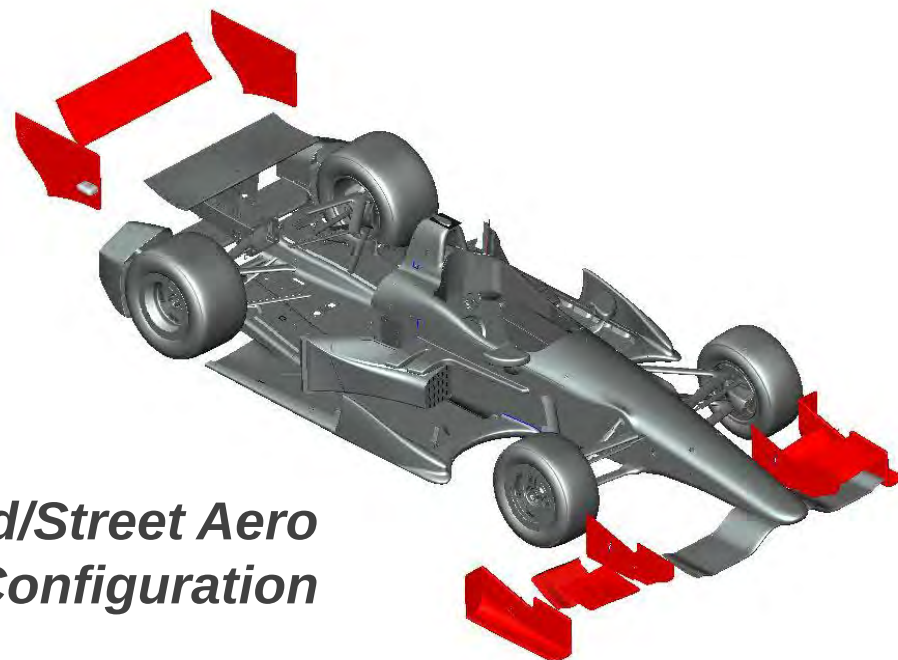


Superspeedway Aero Configuration

WHAT'S NEW FOR 2013

More Points on the Line

For the 2013 season, the IZOD IndyCar Series points structure has been slightly modified to reward performance.

Any driver/entrant that leads at least one lap in a race will receive one bonus point. The driver/entrant that leads the most laps of the race will continue to receive two bonus points.

Additionally, points awarded to finishing positions 19 through 25 have been adjusted, providing a differential instead of a flat system. Previously, finishing positions 19 through 24 received 12 points. Under the new system, there will be a one-point difference between each position 19 through 25. The balance of the points system remains unchanged from 2012.

Two venues return:

The 2013 schedule features the return of two venues with ties to Indy car racing – Pocono Raceway and Houston's Reliant Park.

The return also marks the return to the traditional Triple Crown, which will pay \$1 million bonus to any driver who can win at Indianapolis, Pocono and Auto Club Speedway. The Pocono INDYCAR 400 is the second leg of the Fuzzy's Triple Crown.

Houston's Reliant Park played host to Indy car series races in 2006 and 2007 with both races won by Sebastien Bourdais.

Let's Race Two:

Three IZOD IndyCar Series venues – The Raceway at Belle Isle, Toronto's Exhibition Place and Houston's Reliant Park – will host a pair of races in 2013.

Both races at each of the three doubleheader venues will be full distance with equal points.

Standing starts will be implemented for Race 1 at both Toronto in July and Houston in October. Race 2 at the venues will have a traditional North American rolling start following a few pace laps.

Familiar Faces in New Places:

An off-season game of musical chairs has produced an interesting lineup of driver-team pairings for the 2013 IndyCar Series campaign

- After two years of competition with Chip Ganassi Racing, Graham Rahal moves to Rahal Letterman Lanigan Racing. Rahal isn't the only new driver in the team's two-car lineup. James Jakes moves over from Dale Coyne Racing to drive for RLL, which will also field a car for Mike Conway at Long Beach.
- Schmidt Peterson Racing expands to a two-car effort with the addition of 2012 Firestone Indy Lights champion Tristan Vautier. Vautier joins 2012 Sunoco Rookie of the Year Simon Pagenaud, who finished fifth in the 2012 championship standings.
- Takuma Sato moves from Rahal Letterman Lanigan Racing to drive the famed No. 14 for A.J. Foyt Racing.
- After winning the 2012 IZOD IndyCar Series title with Ryan Hunter-Reay, Andretti Autosport has expanded to four full-time cars with the addition of E.J. Viso. The Venezuelan driver joins Hunter-Reay, James Hinchcliffe and Marco Andretti in the team's lineup.
- Sebastian Saavedra returns to the IZOD IndyCar Series with Dragon Racing as a teammate to Sebastien Bourdais.
- Simona de Silvestro moves to KV Racing Technology for 2013 and gets a teammate for the first time in her young career. Tony Kanaan returns to the team, which is searching for its first win since 2008.

Road rules:

- The pole sitter must start from the inside front row on the start (7.5.1.1), and the race leader must restart from the inside front row on all double-file restarts (7.6.1.2). Previously, the leading driver had the option of choosing their lane (driver's left or right).
- Pit selection for all events outside of the Indianapolis 500 will be based on qualifying results from the previous event (7.4.1). The selection order in 2012 was determined by the qualifying results of the last similar track (i.e. oval qualifying results determined pit selection for next oval event).
- Pit lane speeds have been adjusted to be consistent based on the type of track. All ovals will be 60 mph and all road/street courses will be 50 mph (7.9.11).
- For all events, each team may determine the quantity of E85 fuel it has in its car for the start of the race, further enhancing strategy (Rule 14.19.4.3). Previously tanks were required to have 18.5 gallons of fuel at the start of the race.
- To further emphasize on-track sportsmanship, if a car is deemed by the Race Director to have interfered with qualifications during Segment 1 or 2 of road/street course qualifying, the car will not be allowed to advance to the next segment in addition to having its two fastest laps disallowed. If the offense occurs during Segment 3, the Firestone Fast Six, the car shall not be permitted to participate in the remainder of qualifying (8.3.6.1).
- Push-to-pass will remain as a strategic competition tool for drivers on all road/street course races. Ten pushes will be available per event, with the duration of each push between 15 and 20 seconds based on the course. There will be no activation delay or reset time (14.18.14).

Engine rules:

Changes marking the Engine Sporting Regulations include a lengthening of the engine change-out threshold to 2,000 miles, an increase of 150 miles from 2012 (15.5.1).

Unapproved engine changes will continue to warrant a 10-spot grid penalty at all events except the Indianapolis 500, where the penalty for a full-season entrant will be served at the following event (15.6.1).

Additionally, engine manufacturer points will only be scored by entrants utilizing their season allotment of five engines (10.6.4). Should a driver win a race utilizing a sixth engine, those points would not be awarded to the manufacturer.



Doubleheaders at a glance

INDYCAR will use the following event procedures for the IZOD IndyCar Series doubleheader weekends at Belle Isle, Toronto and Houston in 2013.

Knockout qualifications for first race of the doubleheader weekend will take place on Friday and follow the format of three rounds of eliminations, culminating in the Firestone Fast Six.

As with other road/street course venues, each segment will be 10 minutes in length, with a guarantee of five minutes of green flag running with the fastest driver in Firestone Fast Six earning the Verizon P1 Award and one point.

Qualifications for the second race will be held on Saturday morning and consist of a two 12-minute session with the cars split into two groups.

The qualifying groups will be formed via combined practice times from the day before, with Group 1 determining the odd-numbered positions and Group 2 determining of even-numbered positions based on best lap time ranking, with the fastest qualifier earning the Verizon P1 Award. The fastest driver in each group will earn one point.

Standing starts will be implemented for Race 1 at both Toronto in July and Houston in October. Race 2 at the venues will have a traditional North American rolling start following a few pace laps.

Highlights of the standing start procedures from 2013 IZOD IndyCar Series rulebook include:

Countdown -- The safety car will lead the formation lap and drivers will follow single-file in starting order.

Formation Lap -- During the formation lap, drivers will remain in starting order with no overtaking. The speed of the formation lap will be set by the safety car.

Grid -- At the end of the formation lap, drivers will take their starting positions with the front wheels of the car remaining within its designated orange grid line.

A five-second declaration will be made via radio by the Race Director prior to the start of the light sequence. The starting sequence will begin when the first two rows of red lights on the lighting panel illuminate. The red lights will continue to fill from the bottom of the light panel two rows at a time, for a total of six steps (12 rows).

Once the panel is filled with red lights, there will be a delay between .5 and 3 seconds and the panel will switch to all green lights and the race will begin.

False Start -- A false start shall be declared when a car moves forward or is out of its assigned position before completion of the light sequence. A penalty will be imposed for a false start.

Aborted Start -- The Race Director can declare an aborted start before the final row of red lights is illuminated on the lighting panel. If the start is aborted, the full-course caution lights will be turned on. In the event of an aborted start, a rolling start shall be implemented. Any Competitors whose actions result in an aborted start will move to the rear of the field.

2013 IZOD IndyCar Series Race Recaps

Honda Grand Prix of St. Petersburg – Sunday, March 24 at Streets of St. Petersburg, Fla.

James Hinchcliffe scored his first IZOD IndyCar Series win by holding off Helio Castroneves over the final 26 laps to win the Honda Grand Prix of St. Petersburg.

The 26-year-old Canadian overtook Castroneves in Turn 1 of the 1.8-mile temporary street circuit on a Lap 85 restart. He conserved fuel in the No. 27 GoDaddy.com Chevrolet for Andretti Autosport and held on for a 1.0982-second victory.

He's the first Canadian to win an Indy car race since Paul Tracy in 2007 at Cleveland and gave Michael Andretti his 44th Indy car victory (two more than he had as a driver).

Castroneves, the 2012 race winner, was second and Marco Andretti overtook Simona de Silvestro in Turn 1 of the final lap to earn third place (his best road/street course finish since Toronto in 2011).

Honda Indy Grand Prix of Alabama – Sunday, April 7 at Barber Motorsports Park

Reigning IZOD IndyCar Series champion Ryan Hunter-Reay overtook Helio Castroneves on Lap 76 of 90 and then held off Scott Dixon to win the Honda Indy Grand Prix of Alabama by .6363 of a second.

Castroneves, who won the inaugural event in 2010 on the 2.38-mile, 17-turn Barber Motorsports Park road course, finished third and Charlie Kimball finished fourth. Will Power, who started on the front row, finished fifth.

Dixon has finished second in all four of the IZOD IndyCar Series races at Barber.

"I was driving my tail off trying to stay in front of Dixon," said Hunter-Reay, who rebounded from an 18th-place finish in the season opener at St. Petersburg on March 24.

Hunter-Reay, who earned the Verizon P1 Award the day before in the No. 1 DHL car for Andretti Autosport, jumped 13 positions to third in the championship standings heading to the Toyota Grand Prix of Long Beach on April 21. Castroneves, with his second podium finish, holds a nine-point lead over Dixon.

The victory was the first by a No. 1 car since Sebastien Bourdais at Mexico City in 2007.

Toyota Grand Prix of Long Beach – Sunday, April 21 at Streets of Long Beach, Calif.

Takuma Sato became the first driver from Japan to win an Indy car race, prevailing in the 39th Toyota Grand Prix of Long Beach.

Sato, who started fourth in the 80-lap race on the 1.968-mile, 11-turn street circuit, provided A.J. Foyt Racing its first victory since July 7, 2002, when Brazilian Ayrton Senna won at Kansas Speedway. The last win for the team on a road/street course was by A.J. Foyt on Oct. 1, 1978, at Silverstone, England. Overall, A.J. Foyt Racing has 44 victories.

Sato, making his 52nd IZOD IndyCar Series start, overtook Ryan Hunter-Reay for second on Lap 23 and assumed the point on Lap 30 when race leader Will Power pitted under yellow. The remainder of the race Sato's No. 14 ABC Supply car was strong on both the Firestone primary and alternate tires.

Sato led Graham Rahal across the finish line under caution. It was the best finish for Rahal since finishing second at Texas last June. Justin Wilson, who won that race at Texas Motor Speedway, advanced from the 24th starting position to finish third.

Sato is the third winner in as many IZOD IndyCar Series races this season and climbed to second in the championship standings. Helio Castroneves, who finished 10th, has a six-point lead heading into the May 5 race on the street circuit in Sao Paulo, Brazil. Honda-powered teams swept the podium for the first time this season.

Itaipava Sao Paulo Indy 300 presented by Nestle – Sunday, May 5 at Streets of Sao Paulo, Brazil

James Hinchcliffe led the final 300 yards of the Itaipava Sao Paulo Indy 300 presented by Nestle, which is all that was necessary.

Hinchcliffe overtook Takuma Sato in the final turn of the final lap to win by .3463 of a second, preventing A.J. Foyt Racing from earning consecutive victories.

Hinchcliffe, who won the season-opening race in St. Petersburg, Fla., and did not finish the past two races because of contact in the No. 27 GoDaddy.com car, earned his second career victory and the third for Andretti Autosport this season. He is the first Canadian to win in Brazil since Greg Moore at Rio on May 10, 1998.

Marco Andretti finished on the podium in the No. 25 RC Cola car for the second time (and his fourth consecutive top 10) and Oriol Servia placed fourth after starting 13th in the No. 22 Panther/DRR car. It was his best outing since finishing fourth at Milwaukee last June.

Josef Newgarden, who was running .5285 of a second behind Sato on Lap 70 of 75, finished a career-high fifth after making up 20 spots relative to his starting position.

97th Indianapolis 500 Mile Race – Sunday, May 26 at Indianapolis Motor Speedway

In a race that featured an astonishing 68 race-record lead changes among a race-record 14 drivers, Tony Kanaan earned the victory in the 97th Indianapolis 500 at the famed Indianapolis Motor Speedway. The Brazilian's average speed of 187.433 was the fastest Indianapolis 500.

Kanaan, cruised to the checkered flag under caution when three-time champion Dario Franchitti's No. 10 Target Chip Ganassi Racing car made contact with the Turn 1 SAFER Barrier on a Lap 197 restart. He found himself in front after he and rookie Carlos Munoz overtook race leader Ryan Hunter-Reay entering Turn 1 on the restart for a Lap 194 on-track incident involving Graham Rahal.

Three Andretti Autosport drivers -- Munoz, Hunter-Reay and Marco Andretti -- finished second through fourth. Justin Wilson advanced nine positions to finish fifth in the No. 18 Dale Coyne Racing car. Three-time Indy 500 winner Helio Castroneves was sixth and Team Penske teammate and first-time Indy 500 competitor AJ Allmendinger placed seventh.

Andretti, who started third in the No. 25 RC Cola car and led 31 laps, wrestled the points lead from Takuma Sato after five of 19 races. He leads Sato, 168-157, heading into the inaugural Chevrolet Dual in Detroit presented by Quicken Loans on the Belle Isle circuit June 1-2.

Chevrolet Indy Dual in Detroit #1 – Saturday, June 1 at Raceway at Belle Isle Park

Mike Conway earned his second IZOD IndyCar Series victory with a dominating performance in the first Chevrolet Indy Dual in Detroit presented by Quicken Loans.

Conway, who started second in the Honda-powered No. 18 Sonny's car for Dale Coyne Racing, overtook Ryan Hunter-Reay for the lead on Lap 44 of 70 on the 2.35-mile, 13-turn street circuit, built a 20-second gap leading into the final round of pit stops and went on to a commanding victory.

Hunter-Reay, the reigning IZOD IndyCar Series champion, was 12.9707 seconds back and Conway's teammate, Justin Wilson, claimed his second consecutive top-five finish by holding off 2012 race winner Scott Dixon by .0984 of a second for third.

Chevrolet Indy Dual in Detroit #2 – Sunday, June 2 at Raceway at Belle Isle Park

Simon Pagenaud became the sixth different winner in seven IZOD IndyCar Series races when he drove the No. 77 Schmidt Hamilton HP Motorsports car to 5.6-second victory in the second race of the Chevrolet Indy Dual in Detroit presented by Quicken Loans.

It was the initial win in the series for the native of France and for the team co-owned by former IndyCar drivers Sam Schmidt and Davey Hamilton. It also was the 100th victory for Honda with Indy car engine manufacturer competition.

James Jakes, who started second, finished a career-best second by holding off Race 1 winner Mike Conway by .4342 of a second. Target Chip Ganassi Racing teammates Scott Dixon and Dario Franchitti were next to cross the start-finish line.

Firestone 550 – Saturday, June 8 at Texas Motor Speedway

Helio Castroneves dominated the Firestone 550 at Texas Motor Speedway to take sole possession of first place in the IZOD IndyCar Series championship standings through eight of 19 races.

Driving the Chevrolet-powered No. 3 AAA Insurance Team Penske car, Castroneves led 132 of 228 laps on the 1.5-mile, high-banked oval and won by 4.6919 seconds over reigning series champion Ryan Hunter-Reay in the No. 1 DHL car for Andretti Autosport.

Castroneves is the seventh different winner in eight races this season, and the first to win four IZOD IndyCar Series races at Texas Motor Speedway. It was his first win on an oval since 2010 at Twin Ring Motegi.

It was the first victory of the season for Team Penske and the sixth different team to hoist a trophy in Victory Circle.

Tony Kanaan, who started 13th in the No. 11 Sunoco "Turbo" car, finished third and Ed Carpenter posted his best finish of fourth at the track.

Milwaukee IndyFest – Saturday, June 15 at the Milwaukee Mile

Ryan Hunter-Reay, whose victory in the Milwaukee IndyFest last June was the springboard to claiming the IZOD IndyCar Series championship, repeated the achievement at the historic Milwaukee Mile.

The 32-year-old Fort Lauderdale, Fla., resident overtook race leader Takuma Sato on Lap 198 of 250 and went on to win by 4.809 seconds over Helio Castroneves.

Will Power finished third for his first podium of the season. E.J. Viso and James Hinchcliffe -- Andretti Autosport teammates to Hunter-Reay -- also were in the top five.

The last back-to-back winner at Milwaukee was Tony Kanaan in 2006-07, when he was driving for the Andretti team. It was the 47th IZOD IndyCar Series victory for the team and the fifth at Milwaukee.

Third in the standings entering this Father's Day weekend race, Hunter-Reay heads into the June 23 Iowa Corn Indy 250 presented by DEKALB 16 points behind the front-running Castroneves. Hunter-Reay won at Iowa Speedway last year, and made it three victories in a row at Toronto two weeks later.

An electrical issue on the No. 25 RC Cola car ruined the day for pole sitter Marco Andretti, who entered the race second in the standings and led 61 laps early on. Following repairs, Andretti re-entered the race on Lap 137 and soldiered on to not lose any additional points. He is third in the championship (50 points behind) after placing 20th.

Iowa Corn Indy 250 presented by DEKALB – Sunday, June 23 at Iowa Speedway

James Hinchcliffe, who led 33 total laps on ovals in his previous two IZOD IndyCar Series seasons, led all but 24 to dominate the Iowa Corn Indy 250 presented by DEKALB at Iowa Speedway.

The Toronto native, driving the No. 27 GoDaddy Chevrolet, earned his first victory on an oval. He's the only three-time winner this season and seventh different winner through 10 of 19 races. This time he led Ryan Hunter-Reay across the finish line by 1.509 seconds for the second consecutive Andretti Autosport 1-2 sweep on the .875-mile oval.

Indianapolis 500 champion Tony Kanaan, who had finished first, second and third the previous three outings at Iowa, placed third. Ed Carpenter finished fourth and Graham Rahal earned his second consecutive top-five finish of the season.

Hinchcliffe advanced five positions in the championship standings and is 66 points behind front-runner Helio Castroneves heading into the second half of the season that starts with the Pocono INDYCAR 400 Fueled by Sunoco on July 7 at the 2.5-mile Pocono Raceway.

Castroneves' nine points earned for claiming the Verizon P1 Award in the third heat race is the margin over Hunter-Reay in the standings. Castroneves, driving the No. 3 Hitachi Team Penske car, finished eighth. Marco Andretti, who finished ninth in the No. 25 RC Cola car, is third (-55 points). Seven different teams are represented in the top 10.

Pocono INDYCAR 400 Fueled by Sunoco – Sunday, July 7 at Pocono Raceway

Scott Dixon led a first-ever Chip Ganassi Racing podium sweep to win INDYCAR's return to Pocono Raceway after a 24-year absence.

Dixon earned his first victory since Mid-Ohio last August, while Charlie Kimball tied his career high of second and four-time series champion Dario Franchitti finished third.

It was the 100th win in all forms of motorsports for Target, long-time sponsor of Chip Ganassi Racing and the 200th in Indy car competition for engine manufacturer Honda.

Dixon, who earned his 30th Indy car victory (his first was at Nazareth, Pa.), is the eighth different winner in 11 IZOD IndyCar Series races this season. He crossed the finish line .4572 of a second ahead of Kimball in a race slowed by only two cautions for 12 laps. The average speed of 192.864 mph bested Danny Sullivan's Indy car record 170.720 mph in the 1989 race on the 2.5-mile tri-oval.

Will Power placed fourth and Josef Newgarden matched his best finish of fifth at Sao Paulo in May.

Indianapolis 500 winner Tony Kanaan's prospects of claiming the \$1 million Fuzzy's Triple Crown bonus vanished on Lap 107 when he moved to overtake Dixon's No. 9 Target Chip Ganassi Racing car for the lead on the inside entering Turn 1. The right-front wing sustained damage when it clipped the rear of the No. 9 car, and Kanaan pitted three laps later. Still, Kanaan remains eligible for the \$250,000 prize -- along with Dixon -- if either wins the MAV TV 500 on Oct. 19 at Auto Club Speedway.

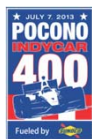
